

HERBICIDES AND PESTICIDES

Use sparingly and dispose of properly as these can contaminate water resources.

PAINT

Choose non-toxic latex paint in favor of oil-based paint whenever possible

Oil base paint

- Avoid buying oil-base paint

Latex paint

- Not hazardous
- Give usable paint to someone who can use it
- Small amounts can be dried it out using an absorbent (kitty litter, sawdust, sand, etc.) until it turns into a thick paste and put in trash

Thinners

PHARMACEUTICALS

Do not flush medications down the drain, toilet, or dispose of in the trash.

Can be taken to any police department

PHOTOGRAPHIC CHEMICALS

NEVER dispose of any photographic chemicals down the drain.

USED MOTOR OIL, OIL FILTERS, ANTIFREEZE

Take materials in containers not exceeding 5 gallons to:

GASOLINE

Put gasoline in container and take to:

HHW Disposal Options

The following products pose a *risk of contaminating* our groundwater and surface water if not disposed of properly. Items marked with a **!** symbol pose *an extremely high risk*

! CFLS & OTHER FLUORESCENT BULBS

Contain mercury. **NEVER** break or dispose of in trash! No drop fee for county residents at Bozeman Convenience Site

! CHLORINATED SOLVENTS (brake cleaners, spot removers, degreasers, etc.)

These petrochemicals are chemically altered and extremely toxic, even at low concentrations, and have the potential to contaminate water supplies. **NEVER** dispose down the drain or in the trash. Avoid buying or using products containing "chloro-" in the name. Use non-chlorinated solvents instead

! ELECTRONIC WASTE (computers, TVs, cell phones, etc.)

These contain lead, cadmium, mercury and other heavy metals. Circuitry in e-waste contains precious metals such as gold, silver, palladium, and copper that can be recovered through recycling processes. **NEVER** dispose of in the trash!

Storage & Handling Tip!

Properly label and store hazardous chemicals in a cool, dry location away from children and pets until you are ready to properly dispose.

! POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYLS (PCBS; older appliances, transformers, florescent lighting fixtures)

Some older household items may contain PCBs if made prior to 1977 when production of PCBs ended. PCBs are oily liquids or solids, colorless to light yellow, and no smell or taste.

Consider using less hazardous products. Unwanted products to:

ADHESIVES, CONTACT CEMENT, ROOFING TAR

Non-friable asbestos only is accepted at:

Must have prior approval from management

AUTOMOTIVE BATTERIES
